Now This is What the Kin-dom of God Should Look Like!

""So we, who are many, are one body in Christ, and individually we are members one of another." — Romans 12:5

On August 24th, our Rally Sunday and Ministry Fair once again reminded me of the joy and energy that happens when the church comes together. With youth leading the way—serving up chili dogs and chili rice that sold out within the hour!— we gathered to eat, laugh, and sign up for Bible studies, choir, ministries, and service opportunities. I was reminded of our very first Ministry Fair four years ago, when Roger and Maxine Butcher exclaimed, "Now this is what the Kin-dom of God looks like!" What a picture of belonging, purpose, and community.

This year, we have adjusted a beloved fundraiser to be our "Faith Marketplace." Our Marketplace felt like an important next step for us as we adapt to life in a post-pandemic world. It may not have been the full-scale Matsuri of years past—with food booths, little (thrift) stores, games, entertainment, and silent auctions—but the heart of the gathering is still the same, we come together not just to raise money, but to "friendraise;" to strengthen the bonds of fellowship, and to remind one another that our church is alive and thriving.

And yet, we must also be honest. Mainline denominations across the United States are shrinking. Families and young people are busier, seniors (all of us, really!) are getting older, and the workforce of the church is not as strong as it once was. But here's the good news: the church does not depend on numbers or statistics—it depends on the Body of Christ, each one of us stepping forward in prayer, service, and commitment.

This fall, we will be exploring several important areas for our life together:

- The Nehemiah Capital Campaign to support both our Building and Visioning Funds, so our facilities can match the mission we are called to live out.
- Visioning for the Church to discern how God is calling us to grow in faith and in service for the years ahead.
- Stewardship cultivating a community that sees itself as trustees of God's beloved community through our financial gifts, but also through our time, talents, and energy.
- Membership and Belonging what it means to truly commit ourselves to God's work through our prayers, presence, gifts, service, and witness.

So let me ask you: How can you be part of this Kin-dom building? Here are some simple, tangible ways:

- Sign up for a shift at the Marketplace or volunteer at upcoming events.
- Invite a friend or neighbor to join you at worship or Bible study.
- Pray regularly for our church, its leaders, and its ministries.
- Give faithfully—not only your offerings, but your talents and energy.
- Share your witness, telling others what God is doing in your life.

The truth is, no one person can do it all. But if each of us does something—offers a prayer, signs up for a ministry, invites a neighbor, lends a hand—then together, we will see the Kindom of God flourish among us.

This season, may we remember Paul's words: "We, who are many, are one body in Christ." Each role matters. Each gift counts. Each step of faith helps build a community where God's love is known and shared.





If you're interested in joining a Hawai'i Mission Rebuild trip to Lahaina, please connect with Rev. Allison. We will be helping Lahaina UMC rebuild their community again.

On September 2, Rev. Allison will be doing a site visit to Lahaina UMC and community and will report back the details for the trip upon her return. She will meet with Pastor John Crewes to learn about the service work, accomodations, and support we will be preparing for as we create teams to help with the rebuild work two years after the devastating fires.

Currently, we are collecting interest forms from those who would like to participate in a Mission Team and will begin holding preparation meeting in the Fall.

For those curious what this trip will entail, we will discuss the following for a Cross-Cultural Engagement and Rebuild Trip to Lahaina:

- Dates that make sense for the participants wanting to attend; currently
 we are looking at a Spring (March/April 2026) and late summer/early Fall
 (August/September 2026) trip. If the group interest is large, we may add a
 group as early as Winter 2026 (January/February 2026)
- Factoring into the trip: Mobility, Costs ("Economic Stimulus Mode" staying in local hotels/Air bnb, "Work Camp Mode" - staying in the bunk house being built for volunteers; also flight fares and meals to be factored in), Work needed, Skillsets to be assessed.
- Identifying Team Leaders to work with Rev. Allison and getting the crews prepared, trained, and ready to go. (Rev. Allison will not lead all the groups if multiple are needed)
- Fundraising within the community both for the trip and for support of the Lahaina community.
