The Advent season begins! We light the first candle of hope as we prepare our hearts for the coming of Christ. Later that day, join us for our annual Charge Conference with DS Saia Tu'itahi presiding.

Faith At the Table

"They all ate and were satisfied. And the disciples picked up twelve basketfuls of broken pieces that were left over." – Matthew 14:20

We gather together to ask the Lord's blessing... I remember singing that tune every Thanksgiving at my home church growing up. Saying grace around the table with loved ones and breaking bread was something we did at every meal. These days, with all the busy-ness of our days, we sometimes forget that simple pause in the day to give God gratitude for our blessings often goes a long way.

Just like the Loaves and Fish story that we hear all the time...with variations to the number of the crowds and how much fish and loaves really did miraculously appear! This Stewardship we've been gathering around our "Fish and Loaves Café" — the table where faith, generosity, and community miraculously meets and grows by Sunday. Week by week, we've reflected on what it means to be good stewards of all that God has entrusted to us. From our Marketplace and Harvest Carnival to the memorials we host with such tenderness and hospitality, we've witnessed how every person and every gift matters.

When we bring what we have — our time, talents, prayers, presence, gifts, service, and witness — God multiplies it. Like the disciples who shared a few loaves and fish and fed a multitude, our small acts of love become blessings that ripple across the whole body of the church. Each volunteer, donor, prayer, and helping hand is a vital ingredient in the feast that sustains our community.

This coming Sunday, as we celebrate All Saints Sunday, along with a table set for our Faith Young People, we will take a moment to remember those who have gone before us — the saints who set the table for us through their faith and service. Their legacy continues every time we extend a hand, open our doors, or make room at the table for someone new. May their memory remind us that stewardship is not just about giving; it's about belonging, about being part of something that feeds both body and soul.

And as we turn toward Advent, our hearts prepare for another kind of invitation — to come and see what God is doing among us. Our theme this year, "What Do You Fear? Insisting on Hope This Advent," invites us to face the uncertainty of our world with courage, faith, and persistent hope. On November 30, we'll launch this new season alongside our Charge Conference, our California-Pacific Palestine-Israel Task Force event, and our Visioning Launch — a day that reminds us that God's story is still unfolding, and we are part of it.

Speaking of Faith's Visioning Launch and preparations for our Nehemiah Project: Capital Campaign, many of you have asked about my time with my family in the Philippines in October. Sandwiched between our UMC's General Commission of Religion and Race: Facing the Future Conference (in El Segundo) and the National Japanese American UM Caucus Convocation that Pastor Becky, Minister 'Ainise, and I participated (in Clovis), Andy, Kaira, and Amara joined me in Manila, as I am a part of the UMC Connectional Table Board of Directors that met in the Philippines (by nature of my role on the General Board of Church and Society). My family was in awe of the beauty and kindness of all those we encountered and in the excitement of experiencing a new place, foods, and people together (the girls even were able to take part in their Godfather, Papa Izzy Alvaran's wedding, right in our hotel room!). The Connectional Table is our worldwide connection of the UMC, where all of the bodies and general agencies of the church meet to share our vision together. This year, the Vision Statement for our denomination reminds us to LOVE Boldly, SERVE Joyfully, and LEAD Courageously, as a reminder that as local churches, we already try to live into this statement!







So come to the table. Bring your stories, your gifts, your hopes, and even your fears. There's a place for you — and there's always enough.

A Season of Change and Hope

There's something about fall that invites us to pause. The air cools, the days shorten, and leaves turn from green to gold before gently falling to the ground. It's a beautiful reminder that change—though sometimes bittersweet—is both natural and necessary.

Recently, Polyana has been learning about photosynthesis in her biology class. She shared how leaves change color as trees begin to rest for the winter. The chlorophyll fades, revealing the brilliant reds, oranges, and yellows that were there all along. I couldn't help but think how similar that is to our spiritual lives—how God's light reveals the beauty that's been within us all along, especially as we slow down and prepare our hearts for what's next. In this season of stewardship, we too are invited to reflect and release—to let go of what no longer serves us and to make space for *generosity*, *gratitude*, and *grace*. Just as trees prepare for new growth, we prepare our hearts for the coming of Christ—the birth of hope itself.

Yet, as we look around our world, change doesn't always feel beautiful. War-torn nations, devastating disasters, government instability, ICE raids in our communities, and senseless acts of violence remind us how fragile and broken our world can be. These are not just headlines—they are realities that touch our neighbors, our families, and our faith. Earlier this month, I attended the No Kings Rally with Polyana. Standing on the corner of Torrance Boulevard and Maple Avenue, I looked around at the people, the signs, and the calls for justice. And in that moment, I found myself whispering, "We need our King." Not a king of power or politics, but the King of Peace—the One who enters our chaos not with force, but with love.

As we journey through this season, let us remember that even in the midst of change, **God is constant**. Even when the world feels uncertain, **Christ is coming**.

Let us hold fast to the words of **Psalm 46:1-2**:

"God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble. Therefore we will not fear, though the earth give way and the mountains fall into the heart of the sea."

May this November remind us that in every falling leaf, in every act of generosity, and in every moment of quiet waiting, God is at work—making all things new.

2026年度の石巻ミッション」

来年、5月18日から5月27日まで、石巻へミッションに行く準備が始まろうとしている。ミッションとは毎年毎年、どんなに準備をしても、何をどう奉仕するのか分からない部分が多くあるので、祈りと信仰により進むしかないと教えられる。

今年は石巻渡波に建てられた野外音楽堂渡波レインボーシアターを見て驚いた。渡波地区は震災後、破壊的ダメージを負い、今なお住民の復帰が進まない。少しでも賑わいを取り戻すきっかけになるようにと、震災で子ども全員を亡くした大工職人遠藤さんが、自宅跡地に建設。親を亡くした子ども達が集う遊び場となる思いで作られた特別な場所である。2024年7月に完成したと聞いたので、次回はそこで母の日コンサートをしたいと願っている。子供からシニアまでが母の日をお祝いし、住民の方が合唱に参加できるプログラムを祈っている。

その他、引き続き牧師宣教師を励ます食事会、女川 復興住宅訪問とESLプログラムの奉仕を予定してい る。

又、今年は、日語部にいた池田ゆみ師が日本宣教のため、夫婦で神奈川県平塚市にある東海大学前で Jlodgeカフェ伝道に参加している。今からカフェ伝道に力を貸してほしいと声がかかっている。素晴らしい!

来年はまず神奈川県で奉仕をしてから、宮城県石巻で奉仕をする。コーヒーやカフェが好きな人、又、 賛美が好きな人は奉仕に参加してほしいと思う。 主の愛を分かち合えるならば、きっと主は祝福のうちに終わらせてくださる。大きなミッションの働きに期待を持ち、日々、霊的準備を怠らずに奉仕をしたい。私たちは「キリスト・イエスにおいて上に召してくださる神の栄冠を得るために、目標を目指して一心に走っているのです。」(ピリピ3:14) Japan 2026 Mission Trip preparation has just begun. It is scheduled for May 18 -27. Each year, there are many aspects that I can't foresee, even though I try to plan carefully. And I learn each year that the only way to move forward is through prayer and faith.

This year, I was amazed to hear about the Rainbow Theater, an outdoor music theatre built in Watanoha, Ishinomaki. The Watanoha district suffered devastating damage after the 2011 tsunami, and residents are still struggling to return. Mr. Endo, a carpenter who lost all his children in the disaster, built this theater on the site of his former home in hopes of bringing some vitality back to the Watanoha community. It is a special place created with the hope that it will become a playground where children who have lost their parents can gather. Completed in July, 2024, we are moved by Mr. Endo's story, and we are praying and preparing for a Mother's Day choral concert there next year. We are praying for a program that will allow everyone, from children to seniors, to celebrate Mother's Day and to have residents participate in the choir.

Other plans include a dinner to encourage Pastor & Missionary families, a visit to the Onagawa government housing complex, and serving in the ESL program.

Also, we recently received a request from a Nichigo member, who returned to Japan this past summer, to assist with their Café ministry near Tokai University in Kanagawa. It will be fantastic to support the evangelism in the Café setting! If you love coffee or music, please join us to reach out and share God's love in Japan. We look forward to new ministries that God is preparing for us next year. We know that He will surely bring great blessings upon us.

We "press hard toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called us heavenward in Christ Jesus." (Philippians 3:14).
