Tell Me Something Good...

Aloha, Beloved Faith Family,

These days, it can feel like the world wakes us up with urgency before we've even found our footing. The news cycle moves fast, the stories are often painful, and the weight of it all can quietly settle into our spirits. Staying informed matters—but so does staying human.

A while ago, I began subscribing to something called the Good News Network because I kept falling down so many rabbit holes of bad, sad, and ugly news. Definitely not my finest “Allison in Wonderland” moments!. But the Good News Network doesn’t deny the realities of suffering or injustice. Instead, it widens the lens. It tells stories of neighbors helping neighbors, communities choosing repair over retaliation, and ordinary people responding to hardship with creativity and care.

I can then find rays of hope after the tragic deaths of a mother and a nurse in Minnesota, with stories of children marching together in a MLK Parade. (*Which, I must share my own headline sidebar: Once again, our “Little Treats for a Big Dream” have made an impact! My husband Andy was waiting at the mechanic for a car repair and started talking to the man next to him... who remembered not only our church marching in the parade, but the little children running to share treats, down to the little girl with the rollerskate shoes! Amara!*) So now adding these new stories alongside the daily headlines has become a spiritual practice for me—a reminder that despair is not the only narrative unfolding.

As we enter Lent, that widening of the lens feels essential.

Our Lenten theme this year, ***Tell Me Something Good***, invites us to listen differently—to attune our hearts to where God’s life-giving work is still breaking through. Lent is often associated with giving things up, but at its core, it is about paying attention. It is a season that asks us to slow down long enough to notice what is shaping us, what is draining us, and what is restoring us.

In a world saturated with bad news, Lent offers us alternative questions—not ones of denial, but of discernment:

***Where is goodness still alive?
What kind of people are we becoming as we take it all in?***

Here at Faith, let’s live into those questions together.

This season, we will gather for a profound conversation with Rev. Dr. Mitri Raheb on the Japanese American Day of Remembrance—a time to honor histories of trauma and loss, while also bearing witness to resilience, faith, and the light that refuses to be extinguished. These conversations are not easy, but they are necessary. They remind us that faith does not rush past pain; it stays, listens, and seeks peace with honesty.

At the same time, we are also nurturing spaces of rest and renewal. Our Sound Baths offer a different kind of listening—one that happens in the body as much as the mind. In a culture that prizes productivity, choosing rest can be an act of resistance and trust. These moments of stillness help us remember that God's goodness is not something we have to earn.

Lent is also a season of recommitment. Membership is one way we say, "I am choosing to walk this path with others." In a fragmented world, belonging matters. Showing up matters. Being shaped by a community rooted in love, justice, and grace matters.

So this Lent, I invite you not only to ask for good news—but to practice noticing it. To name it aloud. To let it steady you. And when possible, to become it for someone else.

Good news does not always arrive loudly. Often, it shows up quietly—in conversations that heal, in practices that restore, in communities that refuse to give up on one another. This Lent, may we learn to recognize those moments as holy. May this season help us stay awake to what is good, even when it is fragile. May it ground us in hope that is honest.

And may it shape us into people who carry light—together.

A Grounding Practice for the Week

When the news feels heavy:
Take one slow breath.
Place your feet on the ground.
Ask quietly, "God, tell me something good."

Notice what rises—an image, a memory, a person, a moment.

Trust that even small glimpses of goodness are holy.



Friends, let us continue to seek the Good News in dark places.

Lent Comes Early & Good News Grounds Us

February invites us into holy anticipation as Lent arrives early this year, beginning with Ash Wednesday on February 18. Ash Wednesday offers us a sacred pause—a moment to remember our humanity, return to our roots, and open ourselves again to God's renewing grace.

This Lent, Faith UMC will journey together through a worship series from Sanctified Art titled *Tell Me Something Good: Grounding Ourselves in the Good News This Lent*. Rooted in the heart of Jesus' ministry, this series centers on love of neighbor, radical welcome, care for the vulnerable, and mercy made visible. In a world heavy with bad news, Lent invites us to remember that the good news of Jesus is still alive, still generous, and still meant for all.

Throughout the season, the life of the church will reflect this grounding work. Lent at Faith will be marked by meaningful worship, intentional prayer, honest conversations, and opportunities to show up for one another and our wider community. Whether through Sunday worship, ministry gatherings, service, or quiet moments of reflection, we will practice slowing down and paying attention to where God is already at work among us.

For me and Polyan, Lent will be shaped by intention and presence. Following Rev. Allison's family, we will attempt to go without social media during Lent, choosing instead to be more mindful of our time together—especially moments that don't require our phones. It's a small practice, but one we hope will help ground us in what truly matters.

As we move into the new year, thank you for your continued dedication to Faith Ministries. Please save the dates for upcoming Council on Ministries (COM) meetings, held in person at Faith UMC Fellowship Hall from 10:00 a.m.–12:00 p.m. on February 28, May 30, August 29, and November 21. Your presence matters—you are key partners in communication and ministry.

May this Lent root us deeply in the goodness of God and send us forward as bearers of good news.

1月12日は成人式。年内に20才になる人を激励・祝福する行事である。今年の新成人の数は109万人。立派になった子ども達を見る楽しい喜びの日である。成人を祝う儀礼は海外でも多く見られる。ヨーロッパではデビュタン上、ユダヤ教徒はバーミツバ、アメリカやカナダでは、Sweet 16 party、ラテンアメリカのキンセアニエーラなどなど。大人になるとは、大きな節目。皆で喜ぶが、何が変わるのか？多くの権利が発生し、親の同意なしに携帯電話、ローン、クレジットカード、部屋を借りるなどが可能。公認会計士や司法書士などの国家資格を取得できる。自由に生活でき、ワクワクするが、注意も必要。自分の行動に責任を負うようになる。知識を身につけ、困ったときは相談することが重要。周りに必ず経験ある大人が必要になる。

They can get mobile phones, loans, credit cards, and rent an apartment without parental consent. They can live freely! However, they must take responsibility for their actions and avoid getting into trouble. It’s important to acquire knowledge and seek advice when needed. Perhaps, it’s wise to always have adults with experience around them.

When Jesus began his public ministry at age 30, he was baptized by John. The heavens opened, and the Holy Spirit descended like a dove. And a voice came from heaven, saying, “This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased.” (Matthew 3:17) God the Father rejoiced! Jesus started His work to fulfill the joy of His Father’s expectations. But, we know that His responsibility and work became unbearably painful at the cross.

As the Lenten season starts on February 18, we want to remember Jesus, who worked responsibly to accomplish his Father’s plan for salvation, and sacrificed for us. 平田

WHAT IS GYPC 2026?

The 2026 Global Young People's Convocation (GYPC) takes place every four years, is worldwide in nature, and is required by the United Methodist Book of Discipline. GYPC is primarily organized by and for United Methodist Young People. GYPC is an event that focuses on young people between the ages of 12-35; adult chaperones and those who serve young people are also encouraged to attend.

WHERE IS GYPC 2026: Dublin, Ireland, at the Crowne Plaza Dublin Airport Hotel.

WHEN IS IT: July 7-11, 2026.

WHO CAN COME?

Young people and leaders from every Episcopal Area of the UMC are invited to be present at the event. GYPC 2026 is a United Methodist denominational event designed to help young United Methodists connect with and better understand their denomination's connectional nature and learn how to advocate and lead in decision-making systems used by the UMC. All denominations, including churches in the Methodist family tree with whom the UMC has partnerships, are welcome, and our worship time will be ecumenical. Most of the workshops and learning opportunities will be specifically United Methodist.

- Young People. This means youth and young adults. Age ranges for those labels change based on geographic location and culture. Our understandings of these age ranges are as follows:
- Youth (Mainly 12-18 years of age, but can be up to 24 years of age)
- Young Adults (19-35 years of age)
- Adult Ministers focused on youth and young adult age ranges. Pastors, ministers, or volunteers with a heart for serving young people and creating ministry opportunities.
- Denominational Leaders. Those who serve in a capacity that is connectional beyond a local church.
- Adult Chaperones. Individuals under eighteen years as of July 7, 2026 (as well as groups with individuals under 18) require an adult chaperone to attend and support their attendance. If traveling with a group, groups are encouraged to have a ratio of one chaperone for every seven participants. Groups that include multiple sex attendees are encouraged to have chaperones who correspond to the demographics of their group. (e.g., if your group includes male and female youth, please have both a male and female adult chaperone)

WHY SHOULD I COME?

Lots of reasons, of course. The Global Young People's Convocation, or GYPC, only happens every four years. For many, attending can be a once-in-a-lifetime experience.

GYPC will be organized around four central concepts:

- **Training:** The United Methodist Church has systems and processes to decide how the church organizes, where it focuses its resources, initiatives and justice work, and so on. We provide opportunities for young people to learn how the systems and processes of the United Methodist Church work so that they, as young leaders, can be advocates and visionaries who can engage in legislative, plenary, and conference sessions at all levels of the church. This is especially important as the UMC envisions its future.
- **Networking:** Our worldwide denomination is wealthy with experiences and stories of young leaders making a difference and growing in their discipleship. GYPC will provide opportunities to meet young United Methodist leaders around the connection and ecumenical partners who share the desire to make a difference. We believe that by building up familiarity and relationships, incoming church leaders can develop friendships and trust.
- **Creating:** The GYPC in 2026 can create statements and legislative proposals for submission to the United Methodist General Conference. There will be opportunities to share items that participants might like to address with the church, practice legislative sessions, perfect statements, and build coalitions to support proposals going forward.
- **Experiencing:** GYPC rotates to different locations around the world, and the event is designed to help participants learn about and experience the local culture and church. Local faith leaders, storytellers, and leaders in the European region will be involved in the main room worship and keynote times. This GYPC promises to be an ecumenical event thanks to our siblings of the Irish Methodist Church and other partners.
